#### Chorus Bio

**VOICES 21C** is a Boston-based, project chamber choir under the artistic direction of Professor André de Quadros of Boston University. The choir consists of approximately twenty-four advanced and professional singers from the northeastern United States. Exploring repertoire from various cultures, periods, styles, and languages, VOICES 21C approaches performances with creativity, joy, hope, playfulness, body imagery, and deep interaction with the audience. VOICES 21C gave its first performance to a standing ovation at the historic mid-sixteenth century church in Vallouise. The concert was part of France's CHORALP Rencontres Chorales Internationales, July 2016. The performance on October 9 is the choir's first US concert.
